A few words from Fr Joe.....

In Rome, there are four major basilicas, St John Lateran, St Peter's, St Mary Majors and St Paul's outside the walls. Here the word 'major' signifies 'greater' it's very clear that they are just that, churches, but bigger and more splendid than the everyday places of worship in regular parishes. To immerse yourself in a visit to a major basilica is very special indeed.

In the world of golf, there are also four majors every year, and these too are golf tournaments that have the status of being greater than the ordinary weekend championships. The 'majors' gather the best players in the world, at iconic golf courses and the competition is intense, the rewards great and the winner is elevated in their reputation among peers and fans. As 'The Master's' is on in Augusta this weekend we will all hear much news of this major if any one of the Irish players are in contention because to win a major is very special indeed.

In Ireland, we sometimes speak of the 'major religious traditions' on this island and if we were to mention four they could be Christianity, Islam, Judaism, and Buddhism, which together represent the religious identity of the majority of religious people in our country. There are of course some smaller faith communities who are mentioned under the umbrella term, 'other'. This broad category of 'major religions' might not carry the same implication of one being better than others, but rather touches into the reality that it is God, however the deity is known and worshipped who is the 'major' reality, the one greater than ourselves, who we come to know, to worship and love. In this past week, the followers of Islam have been celebrating Eid Mubarak, the blessed feast that brings Ramadan to a close, it is one of the major moments in the Muslim life, it is indeed a very special time.

For we who are Catholic this is the Easter Season, definitely the major celebration in our tradition. These 50 days are for accepting the resurrection of Our Lord, his appearances to the disciples, his Ascension into heaven and the sending of the Holy Spirit. As we live through the Easter period we can only grow in faith, deepen our hope and renew our spiritual lives. These are four pretty major religious truths for us to grapple with, reflect on and embrace, all in all a very special time indeed.
