Dear Parishioner,

Please note that our **Tap2Donate** devices were upgraded recently and the new devices allow parishioners to enter their contact details. For example, you can insert your name, telephone number or email address. The information only needs to be entered once.

This in turn allows Kilmacud Parish to accumulate all donations from the tap device, as well as donations from Easter/Summer/Christmas dues and the Family Offering (weekly envelopes). 
Annual Memory Walk on Sunday 21st September World Alzheimer's Day
